Message Regarding Our 2022–2023 District Budget

Each year, District officials begin work on the budget in early January, and work diligently to prepare budgets that support student programming while remaining fiscally responsible to the taxpayers of the district. The proposed 2022-2023 General Fund budget allows the District to continue the implementation of its regular instructional program, and in some cases creates enhancements to programming; allocates funds to meet the social and emotional needs of our students and continue providing Special Education services to our students with needs; and maintains current transportation services.

This year's budget hearing will be held on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. in the elementary auditorium. Scio CSD thanks you for your consideration of the 2022-23 school budget.

Voting Qualifications

A resident of the Scio Central School District shall be entitled to vote who is:

- 1. a citizen of the United States;
- 2. at least 18 years of age by May 17, 2022;
- 3. a resident of the district for at least 30 days preceding the vote.

Absentee Ballot Qualifications

A resident of the Scio Central School District shall be entitled an absentee ballot who is:

- 1. a qualified voter of the district;
- 2. a patient in a hospital or unable to appear personally at the polling place on the day of the vote due to illness, physical disability or COVID concern;
- 3. unable to appear because of duties, occupation, business or studies that require him/ her to be outside the county or city of residence on the day of the vote;
- 4. incarceration other than for conviction of a felony.

Process to Obtain/Cast an Absentee Ballot

A qualified voter of the Scio Central School District voting by absentee ballot must:

- 1. Contact the school by phone or mail and request that an application be sent to them;
- 2. Complete the application and return it to the District; the District Clerk must receive this application at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter.
- 3. Complete the ballot, fold it and enclose it in a special marked envelope, seal it, sign and date the oath;
- 4. Place the official ballot envelope in another envelope and mail it to the District Clerk. It must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the election.



Process to Obtain/Cast a Military Ballot

A qualified "Military voter" means a qualified voter of the state of New York who is in actual military service, as defined in paragraph (a) of this subdivision, and by reason of such military service is absent from his or her district on the day of election, OR a voter who is discharged from such military service within thirty days of an election AND the spouse, parent, child or dependent of such voter accompanying or being with him or her, if a qualified voter and a resident of the same school district. Education Law Section 2018-d (1)(b)

- 1. Contact the school by mail, e-mail, or fax to request that an application be sent to them;
- 2. A valid application must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 22, 2022.
- 3. Complete the ballot, fold it and enclose it in a special marked envelope, seal it, sign and date the oath;
- 4. Place the official ballot envelope in another envelope and mail it to the District Clerk. It must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the election

On May 17, you will be voting on the following:

Proposition 1 - General Budget Shall the Board of Education of the Scio Central School District, Allegany County, New York, be authorized to expend the sum set forth in the proposed 2022-23 budget in the amount of \$11,214,107?

Proposition 2 - Purchase of One School Bus

Shall the Board of Education of the Scio Central School District, Allegany County, New York, be authorized to purchase one 64-passenger diesel school bus, at a total purchase price not to exceed one hundred thirty-three thousand two hundred fiftyone dollars (\$133,251), the balance to be financed by bonding over five (5) years, and to levy the necessary taxes?

Proposition 3 – Establish General Capital Reserve Fund-2022

Shall the Board of Education of the Scio Central School District, Allegany County, New York, be authorized to establish a capital reserve fund under the provisions of Education Law §3651(1) to be known as the "General Capital Reserve Fund-2022" for the purpose of paying, in whole or in part, the cost of additions, alterations, renovations or other improvements to District buildings and facilities, site improvements at District facilities and grounds, including athletic

fields, playgrounds, recreation areas, parking areas, roadways, sidewalks and other site improvements, the acquisition of school buses and other vehicles, and the acquisition and installation of machinery, equipment, apparatus or furnishings. The ultimate amount of the fund shall not exceed \$1,000,000 plus any accrued earnings on amounts deposited into said reserve fund. The probable term of said reserve fund shall be 10 years, but said reserve fund shall continue in existence for its stated purpose until liquidated in accordance with Education Law. The

a) control balances which funds shall be obtained may include any or all of the following:
(a) current and future unappropriated fund balances from the General Fund of the School District, as directed by the Board

of Education, (b) any other appropriations authorized by the voters from time to time, and (c) fund balances transferred from

other reserve funds of the School District, as may be authorized by the Board of Education or the voters from time to time.

Proposition 4 – Scio Memorial Library Shall the Board of Education of the Scio Central School District, Allegany County, New York, be permitted to increase the tax levy for the Scio Memorial Library from \$26,214 to \$26,789?

Election of One (1) Candidate to the Board of Education Vote for one (1): One (1) five (5)-year term to expire 6/30/27

All vacancies are filled "at large". The candidate with the most number of votes will be elected to the board.



Three Part Budget Summary

New York State law requires all school districts to present their budgets divided into three expenditure categories: program, administrative, and capital.

Includes: salaries and benefits of teachers, guidance counselor, aides, nurses, etc.; teaching supplies, equipment and textbooks; library and instructional computer funds; athletics; and transportation costs (except bus purchases).








State Aid & Property Tax Levy as a % of the Budget
