White has Record-breaking Season

Scio graduate Jordan White made certain his last year of track and field was a memorable one.

Jordan will leave a legacy on the school records board with his performance in the 100-meter run and the long jump. In the run, he beat the 11.4 sec. record

previously held by Kiel Nunn (1994), Sam Meyers (1995) and Skylor Saxton (2009). As for the long jump, he flew past the 1965 record of 20'10" held by Paul Fuller and landed 22'1".

He also left his mark at Sectionals when he became Class B5 Section V

champion in the long jump and high jump and was given the Devin Snyder Outstanding Field Athlete award for our class and section. We were proud to have Jordan represent us at the State Meet.





Nickerson Represents Scio at Boys State Conference

Tyler Nickerson was among 11 boys who represented Allegany County at the annual Boys State leadership conference at SUNY Morrisville in June. The week-long retreat immerses high school seniors in citizenship and leadership training.

While Tyler said he does not see himself pursuing a career in politics like many of the boys there (he plans to work toward a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree), he did gain a greater appreciation for the inner workings of our state and local government while at Boys State. Although, he said, there may be a little spark of interest in becoming involved in local politics later in life. "Just to stay involved in my community in some way," he said.

According to the Boys State website: The American Legion Boys State is a week-long program that immerses rising high school seniors in proper citizenship and leadership training. They learn the practical aspects of government as it exists in New York State and come to recognize that the individual is integral to the character and success of government. They also participate in physical training, teamwork, as well as other activities under the guidance of American Legion counselors and U.S. Marines.

Tyler said the days at Boys State were long – awake before 5:30 and lights out at 10:30 with only 10 minutes meals – and packed with things to accomplish. Which is fine with Tyler because, as he admits, "I don't like doing nothing."

Nothing indeed. Tyler is just as busy in his everyday life. He's in band, art, independent study in choir, soccer, basketball, baseball and track. At press time, he was also on the hunt for a job and was making plans to do plenty of summer fishing.

Reflecting on his time, Tyler said he is glad he attended the teen leadership conference. He learned a lot about citizenship and himself.

"I learned that when you're put into a situation like that you can't just sit back and make things come to you," he said. "You have to pursue what you want You need

to get off the sidelines and make things happen for yourself."

Like getting to know his fellow Boys State attendees. He admits that he is not a shy person, but being around that many people in a completely new space can feel overwhelming for anyone.

"You just have to get over yourself in a way and be open to seeing what other people have in store."

He made plenty of new friends whom he knows he will stay connected with. In fact, he said his favorite part of the conference was meeting and laughing with the veterans who guided them through the week.

The Boys State apple doesn't fall far from the tree. Tyler's grandfather, Joe Nickerson (class of 1967), also represented Scio at Boys State the summer before his senior year.
