






Welcome to Our New Principal

Letter to Parents for School Meal Programs Special Provision Options (Provision 2 Non-Base Year & Community Eligibility Provision)

Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that <u>Scio Central School</u> will be implementing a meal certification option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs the 2024-2025 school year.

What does this mean for your child(ren) attending the school(s) identified above?

All students enrolled at <u>Scio Central School</u> are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the school year. No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit an application.

The value of any childcare provided or arranged, or any amount received as payment for such childcare or reimbursement for costs incurred for such care under the Child Care and Development Block Grant, TANF and At-Risk Child-Care Programs should not be considered as income for this program.
